



Brazilian Beats

Coco is an African-influenced musical rhythm that originated in Brazil. It refers to the stomping style of dance performed to the music. The name comes from the Brazilian word "cabeça" (head), as song lyrics are often improvised. The music is commonly performed at traditional parties in the northeast, such as weekend street parties and Carnival. The characteristic sound of coco arises from four instruments: the ganzá, surdo, pandeiro, and triangle. Performers also often wear wooden clogs, the stomping adds a percussive element.

Maracatu is a term common to two distinct performance genres found in Pernambuco state in northeastern Brazil: maracatu de nação (nationstyle maracatu) and maracatu rural. A third style, maracatu cearense, is found in Fortaleza, in the northeastern state of Ceará. Maracatu also designates the music style that accompanies these performances.

Samba is a dance and musical genre originating in Bahia with its roots in the West African slave trade and religious traditions. It is recognized as a symbol of the Brazilian Carnival and an icon of Brazilian national identity. The Bahian Samba de Roda (dance circle), which became a UNESCO Heritage of Humanity in 2005, is the main root of the samba carioca, the samba that is played and danced in Rio de Janeiro.

Ceilidhamba

Over the past few months we have worked with Mestre Allysson Velez from Recife in the North East



of Brazil. Allysson has been exploring cultural similarities and traditions of his home state of Pernambuco with those here in the North East of

For his project Nordeste:North East Allysson has been working with us towards a performance at the Halloween/Samhain festival. Starting with a solo drumming performance from Allysson, dressed in a stag mask, he then led the embryonic North-East of Scotland Samba School round the square. Ceilidhamba creates a new space for socialising and community exchange by working with local musicians/artists and visiting samba mestres.

Allysson has also set up shop in his Casa das Ideias on Bogie Street, where he is working with local musicians of all genres towards the recording of the Ceilidhamba CD that will feature both Scottish traditional music and Brazilian beats of Samba, Marakatu and Coco. For this, Scottish musicians like Paul Anderson, Shona Donaldson and Donal Brown have been working with him as well as NE based Omar Afif with his Afro-Arabian rooted music

During his time in Huntly Allysson also joined Huntly singer Keith Cockburn to work with children from the Gordon Schools and did several artist's talks about the music traditions in north east Brazil and its numerous different styles of rhythm, dance and carnival

What's Next?

Walking off the Grid

From 24 Nov to 8 Dec Austrian artist Michael Höpfner will walk a 30 mile circuit around Huntly for 14 consecutive days. He will be outside all the time and stay overnight in his tent along the way.

Michael is interested in the perception of an unknown environment, the lives of people living within that landscape and the details of sites along the route. The project asks how to leave standardized images and a geographical laptop screen world behind, and exchange it with a geography drawn of personal stories and memories. This walk/absurd pilgrimage leads the hiker into an unknown land, meeting unknown people with a new experience of time. Every day he will negotiate with a different farm about a campsite for the night ahead. People are invited to join the walk and exchange ideas around the Huntly circuit. At the end of the walk, Michael will invite people he met en route for a joint dinner with images from the

This will be the first one in a large series of events dealing with walking as art.

Zimbabwean photographer Nancy Mteki's project will focus on the delights and issues surrounding feeding and nutrition in maternity, particularly working with young mothers in the town. She will explore the bond between children and their mums and document the various forms of sociability across multiple-generation households. Nancy herself is a young mum and will bring her 3-year old daughter Kayla to Scotland. Mteki has made her name in the Zimbabwean art scene through her compositional photographic approach and the aesthetic research evidenced in a series of images taken in private settings. She has also frequently addressed gender issues in her work, notably the place of women in Zimbabwean society.
