Screenprinting workshop

A SCREENPRINTING workshop packed Huntly's Square Deal with beautifully-designed posters, bags and booklets earlier this month.

Glass-based artist Petra Pennington taught people at the free workshop how to screenprint a whole host of items and also read through texts attendees had written in advance.

The texts were produced in response to an open call for writing on the theme of time, and they inspired the designs which were later printed at the July 2 workshop.

The 11 printed images were created by Ms Pennington and explored time in Huntly, time as a routine, time as curren-

cy and even time and death.

The event, put on with help from Deveron Projects, was part of a packed July schedule for the arts group.
